Journal sections:

- **Editorial:** Brief comments on current economic policy questions (1200 words)
- **Forum:** Policy debates on highly topical issues based on contributions from invited experts in research, politics, industry and diverse stakeholders (2500-4000 words per contribution)
- **Articles:** Papers concerned with economic policy issues and trends; papers should be unpublished and based on empirical research (3000-5000 words)
- **Letter from America:** A US economist provides analysis of transatlantic economic issues (1200 words)

Mission

A vast range of economic research creates input for economic policy at the national and – increasingly – at the EU level. **Intereconomics** aims at stimulating debate on economic policy issues and offers a platform for the publication of policy relevant aspects of economic research. It thus provides up-to-date information for policymakers and supports the exchange of ideas for the improvement of policy approaches.

As a journal that contributes to ongoing debates, **Intereconomics** puts high priority on the timeliness of articles, which implies short production times. Articles are thoroughly reviewed and edited by the editorial team of the journal.
